CORAL Conservation Prize 2015 Nomination Form

The CORAL Conservation Prize offers a unique opportunity to recognize outstanding leaders of reef conservation around the world. It aims to support worthwhile local coral reef conservation efforts, provide a platform to highlight coral reefs within the local, national, and international media and provide incentives for continued work in all regions of the world.

CORAL supporters and marine conservation advocates are being invited to nominate others within the coral reef conservation community to receive this special recognition. Specific criteria is detailed below, but include someone focused on locally-based efforts who has made significant progress and to whom specific milestones and progress can be attributed.

The winner, chosen by a small CORAL committee will receive a cash award (\$20,000) and be flown to San Francisco to be recognized and give a presentation on his or her work at CORAL's 2015 gala celebration on September 26, 2015.

Criteria:

- The nominee must be an individual (or a leader of a local group) who is successfully working to advance coral reef conservation at a local or regional scale
- The nominee displays leadership that has resulted in significant positive environmental change, either through a recent achievement or a long career, that can be articulated by the nominator
- The nominee must be able to communicate about his or her work to a US-audience
- The nominee will be able to articulate how this prize will further his or her work and present (once the prize is awarded) a plan for investment
