Bathroom do's and don'ts

- Do use water efficiently and conserve whenever possible
- Do use single ply biodegradable toilet paper
- **Do** use biodegradable shampoos and soaps
- Don't flush anything except human waste and toilet paper

Dishwashing do's and don'ts

- **Do** use dishwashing detergents that are concentrated, low-sudsing, and biodegradable
- Don't use the garbage disposal—dispose of food waste in the garbage instead
- Don't rinse grease down the sink
- Don't pour any chemicals down the sink
- **Don't** use detergents that contain phosphate (a chemical harmful to reefs)

Laundry do's and don'ts

- Do wash your laundry regularly rather than doing many loads all on one day
- **Do** use a laundry detergent listed on the EPA's Design for the Environment website (found at: goo.gl/n21sOr)
- Don't use chlorine bleach in the wash.

Do get out and explore our coral reefs—some of the most beautiful in the state!
